Introduction



Prayers of the Rosary

Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
Amen.

Apostles' Creed

I believe in God,
the Father Almighty,
Creator of heaven and earth;
And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the Virgin Mary,
Suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended into hell;
the third day he arose again from the dead;
he ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty;
from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Mysteries of the Rosary

The complete Rosary now includes twenty decades, divided into four sets of mysteries: Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, and Glorious. Pope Saint John Paul II recommended that they be prayed in this order. However, many people say one set of mysteries a day. In that case, it is suggested to recite the mysteries on the days indicated.

The Joyful Mysteries

(Mondays and Saturdays)



The Annunciation

The Archangel Gabriel announces to Mary that she will be the mother of God's Son.

The Visitation

While she is pregnant with Jesus, Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth, who is pregnant with John the Baptist.

The Nativity

Jesus, the Savior, is born.

The Presentation in the Temple

According to Jewish Law, Jesus is brought to the Temple as an infant and dedicated to God.

The Finding in the Temple

Mary and Joseph find Jesus in the Temple, instructing the elders.

The Luminous Mysteries

(Thursdays)



The Baptism of Christ in the Jordan

John the Baptist baptizes Jesus.

The Wedding Feast at Cana

At Mary's request, Jesus turns water into wine.

Jesus' Proclamation of the Coming of the Kingdom of God

Jesus announces that he was sent to bring Good News—liberty and favor from the Lord.

The Transfiguration

Peter, James, and John see Jesus transfigured. His face becomes as dazzling bright as the sun.

The Institution of the Eucharist

Jesus shares with his Apostles the meal that perpetuates his earthly presence.

How to Pray the Rosary Novenas

The Rosary Novenas require a substantial commitment. The idea is to pray five decades of the Rosary each day for twenty-seven days in petition for a particular request, followed by five decades each day for twenty-seven days in thanksgiving—whether or not the petition was granted. The intent of the Rosary Novenas is to enlist Mary's help in presenting our needs to God. Every request we make may not be granted in the exact way we wish. Many times, God's grace comes to us through people and events we never imagined. Often our prayers are answered, but not as we expected them to be.

The practice of making a novena (which comes from the Latin word for *nine*) has a long tradition in the Church. In the Rosary Novenas, we are asked to make six novenas—three in petition and three in thanksgiving—over fifty-four consecutive days. It does not matter on what day of the week the Rosary Novenas are begun.

A simple checklist is given on the following page to keep track of each day of the Rosary Novenas. Remember, say one set of mysteries (five decades of the Rosary) each day in petition for twenty-seven straight days, and then do the same in thanksgiving (whether you feel your request has been answered in the manner you expected or not) for twenty-seven more days in a row. If you miss a day because of an emergency or forgetfulness, make it up by saying an extra five decades the next day.



Prayer for the 27 Days of Thanksgiving

Hail, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary, my Mother Mary, hail! At your feet I humbly kneel to offer you a crown of roses—snow-white buds to remind you of your joys—each bud recalling a holy mystery; each ten bound together with my petition for a particular grace.

O Holy Queen, dispenser of God's graces and Mother of all who invoke you! You cannot look upon my gift and fail to see its binding. As you receive my gift, so will you receive my thanks; from your bounty you have given me the help I so earnestly and trustingly sought, even if I do not yet fully comprehend your wisdom.

I despaired not of what I asked of you, and you have truly shown yourself as my Mother.

Say the Apostles' Creed, one Our Father, three Hail Marys, and one Glory Be.

The First Joyful Mystery

The Annunciation

Sweet Mother Mary, meditating on the Mystery of the Annunciation, when the angel Gabriel appeared to you with the tidings that you were to become the Mother of God, greeting you with that sublime salutation, "Hail, full of grace! I bind these snow-white buds with a petition for the virtue of humility and humbly lay this bouquet at your feet.

Marian Prayers

The Regina Coeli (Queen of Heaven)

This prayer replaces the Angelus prayer during the Easter Season.

Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia.
The Son whom you merited to bear, alleluia, has risen as he said, alleluia.
Pray for us to God, alleluia.
Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.
For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

Let us pray:

O God, who through the resurrection of your Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, did vouchsafe to give joy to the world;

Grant, we beseech you, that through his Mother, the Virgin Mary, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life.
Through the same Christ our Lord.
Amen.

Short Prayer to Our Lady, the Immaculate Conception

This prayer was given in a vision to Saint Catherine Labouré and is imprinted on the Miraculous Medal.

"O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee."
