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

Glossary

betray – to harm, in word or action, someone close to us; to be disloyal

covenant – a serious agreement between two people or between God and people

disciples – close followers of Jesus, including but not limited to the Twelve Apostles

Eucharist – based on a word for “thanksgiving”; the sacrament in which the substances of bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the words of the priest and the action of the Holy Spirit; the Mass

forgiven – to be excused an offense; the wiping out of sin by God

Holy Communion – receiving of Jesus Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist

instructions – teachings or directions

Lamb of God – Jesus as the perfect and ultimate sacrifice for sin; Paschal Lamb





The Passover Meal

It was a special time of year called Passover. Once a year the people of Israel remembered how God freed them from slavery in Egypt. The people would prepare a Passover feast. They would kill a lamb and offer it to God as a sacrifice for their sins. Jesus and his disciples were on their way to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover, the **disciples** wanted to fix the Passover meal for Jesus. They asked him, "Where would you like for us to prepare the meal?"

Jesus gave two of them instructions.

Jesus told them, "First, I want you here to go into the city. Next, look for a man with a jar of water. He will greet you. Follow the man into a house, then ask the owner to show you to the place where we can have our Passover meal. Finally, when you are in the upper room, begin to prepare the meal for us."



The Bread

Jesus knew that tonight would be His last meal. He had something special he wanted to share with his disciples. He took a piece of bread while they were eating. They were all watching to see what Jesus was going to do with the bread.

Jesus gave a prayer of thanks. Then he broke the bread. He gave each one of his special friends a piece of bread. Jesus said to them, "Take my bread and eat it!" One by one they took the bread from Jesus.

Jesus shared, "When you eat the bread, I want you to remember how much I love you." The disciples knew this moment was very special. They listened to Jesus' instructions.

Jesus continued, "This bread is my Body given for you." Jesus shared with them that His Body would be broken on the cross when he would die for their sins.

The Betrayal

The two disciples said to Jesus, "We will do as you have asked!" So, they went off to the city. They found everything just like Jesus said they would.

Jesus and the disciples arrived at the house that night. They went upstairs to the large room and sat down at the table. They started to eat their meal together. Everyone felt more uncomfortable about this night.

Then Jesus said to them, "One of you eating from this table will desert me no longer. One of you will betray me tonight." The disciples were shocked.

They said, "Oh no! Surely, it will not be me!" They were upset by this news. One by one they asked, "Is it me?" Jesus told them, "You will see who it is by the one who dips His bread with me." Judas took the bread. Then he left the room.

The Wine

The disciples continued to listen to Jesus. Next, Jesus took a cup of wine.

Again, they knew that Jesus was teaching them something very important. Jesus gave thanks to God as he held up the cup of wine.

He offered each disciple the cup. Jesus said, "This is my Blood. When you drink this, remember my Blood poured out for many. Remember, I love you!" One by one each disciple drank from the cup.

Jesus knew he would be the final sacrifice for the people's sins. He wanted them to remember God's covenant. Jesus would be the Lamb of God. The disciples knew that Jesus would go through a lot of pain.

Jesus would suffer so that the people could all be forgiven of their sins. Jesus told them, "This is the last time I will drink this wine until the day I drink the new wine in the Kingdom of God."
