Dear Children and Families,

Shortly after Jesus was born, Mary and Joseph brought him to the Temple. They came to pray and to dedicate their child to God. This Gospel passage (Luke 2:22–40) reminds us of how our parents brought us to Church for Baptism. Like Mary and Joseph, our families are called to pray, both within our homes and in our parishes.

Prayer helps us become closer to Jesus, who loves us very much! Prayer is how we talk and listen to God. Prayer helps us learn the plan God has for us and opens our hearts to receive his grace. These people include our godparents, our grandparents, our aunts and uncles and family friends, as well as our pastor and religion teachers.

My prayer is that you always know the deep love God has for each of us. May the prayers included in this book help you in your journey of faith and your call to holiness. May the Lord, our God, bless you and keep you always in his care.




