Introduction

The Divine Mercy Chaplet, the Franciscan Crown of Mary's Seven Joys, and the Seven Sorrows of Mary (the Servite Chaplet) are additional devotions that can be said using the beads of the rosary. This booklet offers instructions for praying each of these devotions, as well as the traditional (Dominican) Rosary, using passages from Scripture to focus our meditations on each mystery presented.

Don't you share my problems with meditating on the mysteries of the life of Jesus and Mary? I lose my concentration so easily. Sure, I start off fairly well at the beginning of each mystery; but before I realize it I've drifted off into thinking about some upcoming chore, such as my shopping list or some needed repairs at home.

Let's look to St. Dominic and St. Francis of Assisi for guidance to improve our meditation. These two great saints were well acquainted with each other during their lifetimes upon the earth. In fact, so high was their regard for one another and their respective missions that they seriously considered forming one single religious order. Although they ultimately decided that the Lord wanted them to remain separate, both orders retain a close fraternal relationship. In fact, to this very day a Franciscan is often invited to lead the celebration of St. Dominic's feast day for the Dominicans; likewise, a Dominican usually presides over the Mass on St. Francis' feast day for the Franciscans.

What was it that drew these men and their respective orders toward each other? Certainly among other things it was their great love of Holy Scripture and a deep devotion to Our Blessed Lady. Therefore, why don't we combine our prayers with sections from the Bible that apply to those mysteries?

You will be happy to learn that I have found at least ten verses from the Bible that deal with each mystery, even appropriating the *Magnificat* from St. Luke for the Assumption of Mary and *The Book of Revelation's* "woman clothed with the sun" for her Coronation. Thus this booklet shows you how to read a quotation from Scripture before reciting each prayer of these four devotions. This method has enabled me to continually meditate on the specific mystery and still devoutly pray the intervening prayers. For me now, each prayer becomes the melody and the Bible verses the words to my spiritual song.

Come now, let us together pray with Holy Scripture the Divine Mercy Chaplet, the Franciscan Crown, the Seven Sorrows, and the Rosary.

The Divine Mercy Chaplet

The Divine Mercy Chaplet, or the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, is a relatively new form of devotion, but it has theological roots tracing back to the Old and New Testaments. Recent though it may be, it has spread with amazing speed throughout the world. For this purpose God chose as His unlikely instrument a young Polish nun, then called Sister Faustina, now revered as Saint Faustina. From 1931 through 1938, she received messages from Jesus and was asked to be a model and apostle of his mercy.

The message of Divine Mercy that Faustina received was meant not only for her personal spiritual advancement but for all of us. Our Lord even requested that His image be painted for us in accord with her visions.

She was instructed to keep a diary, *Divine Mercy in My Soul*, which has become the basis for the devotion to God's Mercy. This devotion can take the form of a novena, or a prayer (said preferably at 3:00 P.M. each day), or the recitation of a chaplet of five decades, said on traditional rosary beads. The latter is the format which is presented here.

This devotion has culminated in the establishment of the Feast of Divine Mercy, which is celebrated throughout the Church on the First Sunday after Easter.

Because the Divine Mercy Chaplet has five decades of ten prayers each, the traditional rosary beads are perfect for saying this devotion. Instead of saying the Our Father, ten Hail Marys and a Glory Be on each decade, however, we say the special prayers passed on to us by Saint Faustina.

Praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet Using Rosary Beads and Scripture

- 1. On the crucifix, make the sign of the cross while saying: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."
- 2. On the first bead, pray the following opening prayer: You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us. Then repeat three times: O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You.
- 3. On the next three beads, pray one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and the Apostles' Creed.
- 4. On the first bead of each of the five mysteries, announce the name of the mystery and pray the opening prayer.
- 5. Then, aloud or silently, read one verse from Scripture and pray the mercy prayer on each bead, as follows.

The Agony in the Garden

Eternal Father, I Offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in Atonement for Our Sins and Those of the Whole World.

1. "And they went to a place which was called Gethsemane; and He said to his disciples: 'Sit here while I pray.'" Mark 14:32

For the Sake of His Sorrowful Passion, Have Mercy on Us and on the Whole World.

2. "And He took with Him Peter, James and John and began to be greatly distressed and troubled. 'My soul is sor-

rowful, even unto death.'" Mark 14:33-34 For the Sake of His Sorrowful Passion, Have Mercy on Us and on the Whole World.

3. "'Pray that you may not enter into temptation.' And He withdrew from them a stone's throw." Luke 22:40 For the Sake of His Sorrowful Passion, Have Mercy on Us and on the Whole World.

4. "Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will." Mark 14:36 For the Sake of His Sorrowful Passion, Have Mercy on Us and on the Whole World.

5. "And being in an agony He prayed more earnestly and His sweat became like great drops of Blood falling down on the ground." Luke 22:44

6. "And there appeared to Him an angel from heaven strengthening Him." Luke 22:43

8. "And while He was still speaking, there came a crowd, and Judas leading them. 'Judas, would you betray the Son of Man with a kiss?'" Luke 22:47-48

9. "Put your sword back into its place; for all who take the sword will perish by the sword." Matthew 26:52 For the Sake of His Sorrowful Passion, Have Mercy on Us and on the Whole World.

10. "Then all his disciples abandoned Him and fled.... Those who had seized Jesus led Him to Caiaphas the high priest...but Peter followed Him as far as the courtyard." Matthew 26:56-58

The Scourging at the Pillar

Eternal Father, I Offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in Atonement for Our Sins and Those of the Whole World.

1. "...the high priest asked Him: 'Are you the Christ, the Son of the Blessed One'.... And Jesus said: 'I am; and you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of Power....'" Mark 14:61-62

> *For the Sake of His Sorrowful Passion, Have Mercy on Us and on the Whole World.*

2. "And they all condemned Him as deserving death. And some began to spit on Him and to strike Him...." Mark 14:64-65

The Crowning with Thorns

1. "Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the praetorium and they gathered the whole battalion before Him." Matthew 27:27

2. "And they stripped Him and put a scarlet robe upon Him...." Matthew 27:28

9. "Then Jesus, crying out with loud voice, said: 'Father, into Your hands I commend My spirit.'" Luke 23:46 For the Sake of His Sorrowful Passion, Have Mercy on Us and on the Whole World.

10. "Jesus said, 'It is accomplished' and He bowed His

head and gave up His Spirit." John 19:30 For the Sake of His Sorrowful Passion, Have Mercy on Us and on the Whole World.

Concluding Prayers for the Divine Mercy Chaplet

- 1. Pray three times: "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world."
- 2. Pray once: "Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless, and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us, and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments, we might not despair, nor become despondent, but with great confidence, submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy Itself. Amen."
- 3. With the crucifix, make the sign of the cross, while saying: "In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."
